Dear parents/guardians,

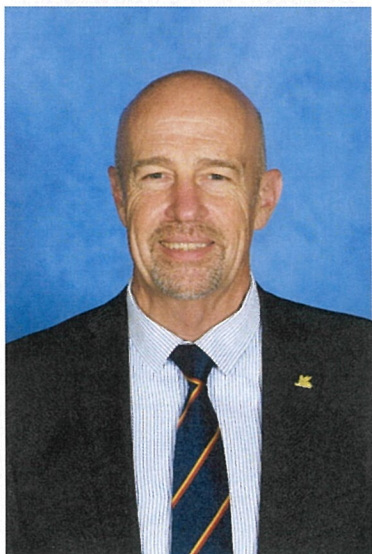

2024 Contributions and Charges

Under Government guidelines, the school requests contributions from Year 7 – 10 parents to assist in the education of their children. These are used to provide resources for the compulsory subject areas of **Mathematics, English, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Technology and Enterprise, The Arts, Health and Physical Education**. This includes hire of textbooks or the provision of text materials in the lower years.

In 2024, our Finance Office will be open for your enquiries and to receive payments from 8am, Wednesday 24 January 2024 (excluding the public holiday on 26 January). The Finance Desk can be accessed by attending our school reception.

Applications can be completed for the Secondary Assistance Scheme at this time – please bring your relevant concession cards and your bank details to assist with your application.

Payment methods

We offer various methods of payment to assist you in paying your Contributions and Charges at Perth Modern School.

- Our preferred method of payment is via the Qkr! (pronounced “quicker”) app. Qkr! Can be downloaded as a smartphone app or visiting their website at www.qkr.mastercard.com
- Complete the payment slip at the bottom of the Charges and Contributions sheet and return to the school.
- Full payment by cheque, cash, credit/debit card in person or over the phone to the Finance Office on 9392 6843 between 8am and 3.45pm from Wednesday 24 January 2024, excluding public holidays.
- Payments by pre-approved instalments using the above methods.

Secondary Assistance Scheme

The Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) allowance is for students in full-time secondary education: Years 7 – 12. Parents/guardians must apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme each school year (annually) as applications do not carry forward to future years.

The allowance consists of two components:

1. \$235 Education Program Allowance which is applied towards education program Charges in the first instance, with any residual to be applied to the Voluntary Contributions.
2. \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or to the school with the money to be allocated to the Voluntary Contributions and Charges account.

Eligible Criteria

To be eligible for the allowance, the parent/guardian must hold a Services Australia (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

If you are eligible, please complete the 2024 Secondary Assistance Scheme Application form provided with this booklet and bring it to the Finance Office, together with your current Centrelink/Veteran's Affairs Card.

Applications close 28 MARCH 2024 no late applications can be accepted.

Additional Cost Items

Included in this booklet is a schedule of Additional Cost Items you may be required to pay during the 2024 school year. Not all costs will be incurred by all students and information will be sent home via Compass Events for consent and payments if required.

It is an expectation of the school and the Perth Modern School Board that compulsory charges are paid prior to students attending tours, camps, social events and non-curriculum based activities.

Medical/Ambulance Insurance

The Department of Education does not have a whole school accident insurance plan and as such does not provide personal accident insurance for students.

Parents/guardians of students in public schools are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students. It is recommended that you have family ambulance cover as the cost of an ambulance must also be covered by parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may wish to consider purchasing a student accident policy available from insurers, which provides medical cover, including ambulance costs.

Student Private Property Insurance

If private property is lost/stolen/damaged, the school is not insured to replace these items, nor can it buy private property replacement items from public monies. The responsibility for the replacement of private property lies with parents/guardians. Family or personal insurance is therefore an essential consideration for parents to cover these items – e.g. music instruments, computers, mobile phones, etc. Most companies supplying computers can identify insurance companies which cover these.

Please be aware that some household insurance policies do not cover personal items, so parents will need to be explicitly aware of what is and what is not covered by their existing policies.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who should pay and when?

Given that all students benefit from the pool of collected funds, it is fair to expect that all parents or guardians should pay their Voluntary Contributions and Charges. Declining to pay voluntary contributions may mean we cannot maintain the high standard of educational materials for your child. We encourage you to pay these, and we offer a range of family friendly payment facilities.

You are encouraged to pay your Contributions and Charges before the end of Term 1. Funds received are used to purchase resources during the year.

What if I cannot pay my Contributions and Charges in full?

We are aware that for some families this may be a burden. Payment plans are available to support parents/guardians experiencing difficulties. To arrange a payment plan, please contact the Finance Office on 9392 6843.

What happens if my child changes subjects through the year?

An adjustment will be made to your child's account and an up-to-date Contributions and Charges sheet will be forwarded to the parent/guardian.

Your Account Explained

The following information is an example to assist parents to understand the school's Contributions and Charges for their child. The Perth Modern School Board has reviewed and endorsed the Contributions and Charges for 2024 and ensured that we acted in accordance with the Education Act. We aim to keep the costs as low as possible.

School Charges & Voluntary Contributions—Years 7-10

\$235 is requested for each student towards the cost of textbooks, materials and services used by students in the educational program. The payment of these contributions makes a significant contribution to the quality of education programs delivered. There is the expectation that families who can afford to pay the Voluntary Contributions do so.

School charges for the elective subjects your child will study during 2024 are compulsory.

School Charges—Years 11-12

For Years 11 and 12, there are no maximum charges that are set by the State Government. The school sets their own charges for these years and such charges are compulsory. The individual charges for each subject your child will study during 2024 are listed on your Contributions and Charges sheet. Charges vary depending upon the course with some incurring higher costs.

Subjects your child is undertaking

These items are available to students and parents are expected to meet these costs.

Subject Charges are compulsory, covering the costs of consumable items and activities your child is undertaking.

Print Credit is pre-pay for the printing of documents accessed via the school's network.

Gifted and Talented Enrichment & Activities

The Gifted and Talented (GAT) selective schooling program at Perth Modern School allows students to access various activities that will enrich and extend their educational experiences.

Voluntary Approved Requests

To assist in meeting the costs of other services offered to students, the school requests parents to contribute to:

Library: used towards the resourcing and updating of library materials for all students and is a valuable resource in assisting your child with their educational programs.

Technology: to assist the school in the management and upgrading of IT systems and for the purchase of software programs and licences to assist with the delivery of the curriculum programs.

Student Services: assists in maintaining a full-time School Nurse, School Psychologist and Chaplain who are an important part of the Student Services' team.

P&C Donation (per family): the P&C supports the school and educational wellbeing of our students. It provides funding for many school activities and the provision of resources, facilities and amenities not provided by the Government, and a focus for social interaction. This donation assists the P&C in these endeavours and reduces the need for further fundraising.

Foundation Building Fund (tax-deductible for donations over \$2): the Perth Modern School Foundation Building Fund is an approved tax-deductible school building fund. A separate tax receipt will be issued. All donations are directed towards school identified building and upgrade projects.

Campion Education are the preferred supplier for Perth Modern School and can supply the personal use items and textbooks on your resource list. You are, of course, free to purchase your requirements from any supplier of your choice. If your child is studying a subject not listed on the resources list no specific requirements are needed, only basic stationery.

Students in Years 7-10 do not require textbooks unless they're taking an accelerated subject in Year 10.

School Diary

The Perth Modern School Diary is a resource for students in the Middle Years (Years 7-9) to encompass the Thriving Minds framework with the love of learning.

The diary will be used by Advocacy and subject teachers to encourage good study habits and routines to help your child manage the changing demands of high school.

These are provided to students at the start of the year and is available for payment through Campion.

Portfolio folder

The Perth Modern School Portfolio is for students to store the certificates that they achieve during their journey at Perth Modern School. This is available for payment through Campion.

Smart Rider cards

All Year 7 students and new enrolments to Perth Modern School are issued with a Transperth Smart Rider card. This entitles students to access concession fares on public transport. Students may also use these cards to access their QuickCliq system at the Serendipity Food Lab (school café). In the first week of Term 1, the school takes students photos and arranges for the cards to be issued as soon as possible.

Replacement for lost or stolen cards are available through the school finance office at a cost of \$5.

School Uniforms

Perth Modern School Uniform Policy has been developed in consultation with the School Board and members of the school community, including students. It is compulsory for all students to wear the correct uniform as it plays an important part in establishing a positive community identity and contributes to the creation of an appropriate work ethic.
