2026 Contributions and Charges

Your child's personal account for 2026 will be posted to arrive by 1 December 2025.

In line with Government guidelines, the school requests contributions from families of students in Years 7 to 10 to support their child's education. These contributions help provide essential resources for the compulsory learning areas of Mathematics, English, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Technology and Enterprise, The Arts, and Health and Physical Education. This includes the hire of textbooks and the provision of other necessary materials, particularly in the lower years.

Families are welcome to make payments for your 2026 account before the end of this year. Parents and guardians are encouraged to finalise payment of Contributions and Charges by the end of Term 1, 2026.

Please note that the school office will close from **20 December 2025**, and will reopen at **8.00am on Tuesday, 27 January 2026**. Secondary Assistance Scheme applications can be completed at this time – please bring a valid Concession Card and your bank details to support your application.

Your Account Explained



The following information is provided to help parents understand the school's Contributions and Charges for 2026. The Perth Modern School Board has reviewed and endorsed these charges, ensuring compliance with the Education Act. Every effort has been made to keep costs as low as possible.

Voluntary Contributions & Compulsory Charges—Years 7-10

A *Voluntary Contribution* of \$235 per student is requested to help cover the cost of textbooks, materials, and services used in the educational program. These contributions make a significant difference to the quality of the learning experience we can provide. Families who are in a position to pay the Voluntary Contribution are strongly encouraged to do so.

Compulsory Charges apply for elective subjects your child selects for 2026. These charges are not voluntary and must be paid.

Compulsory Charges—Years 11-12

For Years 11 and 12, there are no maximum charges set by the State Government. The school determines its own *Compulsory Charges*, which are not voluntary and must be paid. The individual subject charges for your child's 2026 program are listed on the Contributions and Charges statement. These vary depending on the course, with some subjects incurring higher costs due to the materials, resources, or external services required.

Subjects your child is undertaking

These items are available to students and parents are expected to meet these costs.

If you do not wish to receive the Year Book, please notify the school.

Subject Charges are compulsory, covering the costs of consumable items and activities your child is undertaking.

Pre-pay Print Credit for printing documents accessed via the school's network.

Gifted and Talented Enrichment & Activities (\$100)

The Gifted and Talented (GAT) selective schooling program at Perth Modern School allows students to access various activities that will enrich and extend their educational experiences.

Voluntary Approved Requests

To assist in meeting the costs of other services offered to students, the school requests parents to contribute to:

Library (\$30) : used towards the resourcing and updating of library materials for all students and is a valuable resource in assisting your child with their educational programs.

Technology (\$75) : to assist the school in the management and upgrading of IT systems and for the purchase of software programs and licences to assist with the delivery of the curriculum programs.

Student Services (\$75) : assists in maintaining a full-time School Nurse, School Psychologist and Chaplain who are an important part of the Student Services' team.

P&C Donation (\$100 per family) : the P&C supports the school and educational wellbeing of our students. It provides funding for many school activities and the provision of resources, facilities and amenities not provided by the Government, and a focus for social interaction. This donation assists the P&C in these endeavours and reduces the need for further fundraising.

Foundation Building Fund (tax-deductible for donations over \$2): the Perth Modern School Foundation Building Fund is an approved tax-deductible school building fund. A separate tax receipt will be issued. All donations are directed towards school identified building and upgrade projects.



Payment Methods

To assist with payment of Contributions and Charges, Perth Modern School offers several payment methods.

- ⊗ Our preferred method of payment is via the Qkr! (pronounced 'Quicker') app. Qkr! can be downloaded as a smartphone app or alternatively visit the [Qkr! website](#).
- ⊗ Complete the payment slip at the bottom of the Contributions and Charges statement and return to the school.
- ⊗ Cash in person or credit/debit card in person/over the phone to the Finance Office 9392 6843, between 8:00am and 3:45pm.

Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS)

The [SAS](#) is to assist low-income families with secondary schooling costs for students in Years 7 to 12. Parents/guardians must apply for SAS each school year (annually) – applications do not carry forward to future years.

The allowance consists of two components:

- ⊗ \$235 Education Program Allowance which is paid directly to the school and deducted from the Contributions and Charges account.
- ⊗ \$115 Clothing Allowance which is paid to the parent/guardian or to the school if you wish the money to be allocated towards the Contributions and Charges account.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink Health Care Card, Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue card) with the student's name listed on it.

If eligible, please complete the 2026 Secondary Assistance Scheme Application form provided with this package and bring it to Reception, together with your current concession card.

Applications can only be processed in Term 1, with applications opening on Monday 2 February 2026 and closing on Thursday 2 April 2026. No late applications can be accepted.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is expected to pay and when?

All students benefit from the resources funded through Contributions and Charges. Therefore, it is reasonable to expect that all parents and guardians contribute. Choosing not to pay may impact our ability to maintain high-quality educational materials and experiences for your child.

We encourage families to make payments by the end of Term 1, as funds are used throughout the year to purchase essential resources. A variety of flexible, family-friendly payment options are available to assist you.

What if I cannot pay my Contributions and Charges in full?

We understand that financial circumstances vary, and for some families, payment may be challenging.

To support you, payment plans are available. Please contact the Finance Office on (08) 9392 6843 to discuss options confidentially.

What happens if my child changes subjects during the year?

If your child changes subjects, we will adjust their account accordingly. An updated Contributions and Charges statement will be sent to the parent or guardian.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to pay Contributions and Charges by end of Term 1 2026.

2026 Resource List

The 2026 Resource List is available on the Perth Modern School website under *Parent Essentials – Resource Lists*, in Compass under *School Documentation – Finance*, or online at Campion - www.campion.com.au using access code: **J7PW**

Campion Education are our preferred Resource List supplier, although you are free to purchase these items from a supplier of your choice. If your child is studying a subject not listed on the Resource List, no specific requirements are needed, only basic stationery. Textbooks are not required in Years 7-10 unless taking an accelerated subject in Year 10.

Portfolio Folder

The Portfolio Folder is to store certificates students achieve throughout their time at Perth Modern School. Payment is made through Campion, and folders are distributed by the school.

Smart Rider Card (Years 7 and all new enrolments in other years)

All Year 7 students and new enrolments to Perth Modern School are issued with a Transperth Smart Rider card which entitles students to access concession fares on public transport. In the first week of Term 1, the school takes student photos and arranges for the cards to be issued as soon as possible.

Replacements for lost or stolen cards are available through the school at a cost of \$5.

Insurance

Student Accident

The Department of Education does not provide whole-school accident insurance, and students are not covered for personal accidents. Parents/guardians are responsible for any medical expenses, including ambulance costs, if a student is injured.

We strongly recommend having family ambulance cover, and you may also wish to consider a student accident insurance policy from a private insurer, which can help cover medical and ambulance costs.

School Uniform

Lowes Uniform Shop

The Perth Modern School Uniform Shop is run by Lowes and is located at the school, near Reception outside the Andrews building on Roberts Road. It is operated independently from the school and all uniform payments are made directly to Lowes. Their contact phone number is **9388 3543**. **Opening times are Mondays and Thursdays 8.00am to 11.30am during term. Please check the school website for opening times during school holidays.**

School Diary

Designed for students in Years 7–9, the diary supports the *Thriving Minds* framework and fosters a love of learning. Advocacy and subject teachers use it to promote effective study habits and routines as students adjust to high school life. Payment is made through Campion, and diaries are distributed by the school.

Additional Cost Items

This booklet includes a schedule of Additional Cost Items that may apply throughout the 2026 school year. Please note not all students will incur these costs. Where payment is required, details will be provided via Compass Events.

It is the expectation of both the school and the Perth Modern School Board that compulsory charges are paid prior to students participating in tours, camps, social events, and non-curriculum-based activities.

Student Private Property

Please note that the school is not insured to replace lost, stolen, or damaged personal items, and public funds cannot be used for this purpose. Responsibility for replacement lies with parents/guardians.

We recommend considering personal insurance for valuable items such as laptops, musical instruments, and mobile phones. Be aware that some household insurance policies may not cover personal belongings—please check your coverage.

Second-hand Uniform Shop

Perth Modern School's P&C operates a Second-hand Uniform Shop with a range of good quality current uniforms including music uniforms. The shop, run by parent volunteers, is located on the lower level of the Andrews Building. All transactions are card only, and there is a no-return policy on all purchases. **Opening dates vary, although are usually on a Monday from 8.30am to 11.30pm.
